the six winter monthswill be defeated by huge batteries of light , and make possible the establishing of air-fieldsfor the future inter-continental air servicesby making these areasaslight as day. Present flying routeswill be completely changed, for the A ntarctic refueling baseswill make flightsfrom A ustralia to South America comparatively easy over the 5,000 milesjourney. The climate isnot likely to offer an insuperable problem, for the explorer A dmiral Byrd hasshown that the climate ispossible even for men completely untrained for expeditionsinto thosefrozen wastes Some of his partieswere men who had never seen snow before, and yet he recordsthat they survived the rigorsof the A ntarctic climate comfortably, so that, provided that the appropriate installations are made, wemay assumethat human beingsfrom all countries could live there safely. Byrd even affirmsthat it isprobably the most healthy climate in the world, for the intenæ cold of thousandsof yearshassterilize thiscontinent, and rendered it absolutely germfree, with the consequencesthat ordinary and extraordinary sicknessand diseasesfrom which man suffersin other zoneswith different climatesare here utterly unknown. There exist no problems of conservation and preservation of food supplies, for the latter keep indefinitely without any signsof deterioration; it may even be that later generationswill come to regard the A ntarctic asthe natural storehouse for the whole world.
