https／／www．100tes．com／kao＿ti2020／124／2021＿2022＿PET SLevel5＿ c88＿124704．htm TapescriptFor thos of you who are either already studying in the U nited Statesor plan to one day，it might be interesting to know something about the foreign student population in the U nited States．For the academic year 1995／96 there wasatotal of approximately 344,000 foreign studentsstudying in the U nited States．Thisfigure of 344,000 may semm like avery large number until you compare it with the total population of $241,000,000$ ．The foreign student population hasbeen growing for anumber of yearsand is still growing，but the rate of increase has Odropped sharply during the 1990s．During the 1980s，the population grew quite rapidly．For example，between 1985 and 1990，the averoge yearly increase was $12.5 \%$ ．H owever，the picture in the 1990sisquite different．The rate of increase hasdeclined quite noticeably．In fact，the rate of increase between 1994／95 and 1995／96 wasonly ．5\％，or one half of one percent．Although the overall rate of increase has Odropped to only $.5 \%$ ，the number of studentsfrom some partsof the world is increasing while the number of studentsfrom other areas is decreasing．For example，during thissame time period，that is between the academic years94／95 and 95／96，there was a decrease in the number of studentsfrom the Middle East，while the number of studentsfrom South and East A siaincreased．Theer changes in the number of studentscoming from different partsof the world no doubt reflected changing economic and political situations．Im sure
you are aware of many of these changes, and perhapswe can discuss them at our next meeting. For today letsconfine our talk to first, a discussion of the origin of these students, or, in other words, where they come from. second, the kindsof studiesthey pursue. and, finally, the academic levelsthey are found in. If we have alittletime left, we might quickly discussin which geographic areasmost of them go to school.Letsdiscussthe originsof the foreign student population in the U nited Statesfor the academic year 1995/96. Lets discussit in order from those areassending the most studentsto those areas sending the fewest students. If we look at the figures provided by the annual census of foreign studentsin the U nited Statesfor the year 1995/96, we see that most of the foreign students studying in the U nited Statesduring thisyear were from South and East A sia. Thisisa rather large geographical areawhich includessuch countriesasChina, Korea, Pakistan, India, M alaysia, and Indonesia. The total number of studentsfrom thisarea, South and East A siawas 156,830 . In other words, roughly 2 out of every 5 foreign students come from South and East A sia. A Imost 24,000 of thistotal were from China. Malaysiawasclose behind with just a little over 23,000 students. The next largest number of studentscame from the Middle East. Thenumber of studentsfrom the Middle East came to about one third the number from South and East A sia. The fourth largest number came from South A merica. Next cameEurope, A frica, N orth A merica, and O ceania. Letsrecapitulate what weve said. The largest number of studentsstudying in the U nited Statesduring the academic year 1995/96 were from South and East A sia, followed by
theM iddle East, South A merica, Europe, A frica, N orth A merica, and O ceania.W hat fields are theee large numbersof foreign students studying in? It probably wont surpriseyou to learn that the largest number are in the field of engineering. In fact, 21.7\% of the total number are studying engineering. Business and management isclose behind, however, with atotal of $18.9 \%$. The third most popular field wasmathematicsand computer scienceswith $10.3 \%$. A syou can see, engineering with $21.7 \%$, businessand management with $18.9 \%$, and mathematicsand computer scienceswith $10.3 \%$ comprise about one half of the total number of foreign studentsLetstalk about which academic levelsthese studentscan be found in. Foreign studentscan be found studying at all levelsof higher education. A syou might expect, the greatest number of them are studying at the undergraduate level ?approximately 158,000 . The second largest group study at the graduate level and that number isjust under 122,000 . The rest study at junior collegesor in non-degree programs. It is at the graduate level that foreign studentshave the most impact. W hile foreign studentscomprise only 27\% of the total U.S. student population, they account for $8.7 \%$ of all the graduate students studying at U. S. institutions Let megive you those percentages again so you can get abetter feel for the overall picture. Foreign studentsmake up only 2.75 of the total U. S. student population, but they make up 8.7\% of the total graduate student population.W ell, I seethatsall the time we have today.
