Each of us shares with the community in which we live a store of words and meanings as well as agreeing conventions as (1) to the way in which words should be arranged to convey a particular (2) message: the English speaker has in his disposal a vocabulary and a (3) set of grammatical rules which enables him to communicate his (4) thoughts and feelings, in a variety of styles, to the other English (5) speakers. His vocabulary, in particular, both that which he uses actively and that which he recognises, increases in size as he grows older as a result of education and experience. (6) But, whether the language store is relatively small or large, the system remains no more than a psychological reality for the individual, unless he has a means of expressing it in terms able to be seen by another (7) member of his linguistic community. He has to give the system a concrete transmission form. We take it for granted that the two most (8) common forms of transmission—by means of sounds produced by our vocal organs (speech) or by visual signs (writing).
