S. presidential election in more than a century, one certain to leave scarsin abadly divided country.It wasabitter ending for Mr. Gore, who had outpolled Mr. Bush nationwide by some 300000 votes, but, without Florida, fell short in the Electoral College by 271votesto 267-the narrowest Electoral College victory since the turbulent election of 1876.Mr. Gore wassaid to be distresed by what he and many Democratic activistsfelt wasa partisan decision from the nationshighest court.The 5 -to - 4 decision of the Supreme Court held, in esence, that while avote recount in Floridacould be conducted in legal and constitutional fashion, asMr. Gorehad sought, thiscould not be done by the Dec. 12 deadline for statesto Oselect their presidential electors.JamesBaker 3rd, the former secretary of state who represented Mr. Bush in the Floridadispute, issued a short statement after the U. S. high court ruling, saying that thegovernor was" very pleased and gratified." Mr. Bush was planning anationwide speech aimed at trying to begin to heal the countrysdeep, aching and varied divisions. He then wasexpected to meet with congressional leaders, including Democrats. Dick Cheney, Mr. Bushsruing mate, wasmeeting with congressmen W ednesday in W ashington. W hen Mr. Bush, who is 54 , issworn into office on Jan.20, he will be only the second son of a president to follow his father to the W hite H ouæ, after John A damsand John Q uincy Adamsin the early 19th century.Mr. Gore, in hisspeech, was
expected to thank hissupporters, defend hishive week battle asan effort to ensure, asamatter of principle, that every vote be counted, and call for the nation to join behind the new president. Hewas described by an aide as" resolved and resigned." While some constitutional expertshad said they believed statescould present electorsaslate as Dec. 18, theU. S. high court made clear that it saw no such leeway.TheU.S. high court sent back " for revision" to the Florida court itsorder allowing recountsbut made clear that for all practical purposestheelection wasover.In itsunsigned main opinion, the court declared, " The recount process, in itsfeatures here described, isinconsistent with the minimum procedures necessary to protect the fundamental right of each voter." That decision, by acourt fractured along philosophical lines, left one liberal justice charging that the high courts proceedingsborea political taint.Justice John Paul Stevenswrote in an angry dissent:" Although we may never know with complete certainty the identity of the winner of thisyearspresidential election, the identity of the loser isperfectly clear. It isthe nationsconfidence in the judge asan impartial guardian of the law." But at the end of five semingly endlessweeks, during which the physical, legal and constitutional machinesof the U. S. election were pressed and sorely tested in ways unseen in more than a century, the s/stem finally produced aresult, and one most A mericans appeared to be willing at lease provisionally to support.T he Bush team welcomed the newswith an outward show of restraint and aplomb.
