The Hang Seng China Enterprises Index went down 136.49 points, or 1.37 percent, to close at 9,790.79 on Friday. The H-shares index, initiated in August 1994 and readjusted on Jan. 5, 2009, tracks the overall performance of 43 major Chinese mainland enterprises listed on the Hong Kong Stock Exchange. The Hang Seng China H-Financials Index also dived 156.29 points, or 1.22 percent to 12,641.06. 把金融英语站点收藏 The H-Financials Index, initiated on Nov. 27, 2006, readjusted on Sept. 10, 2007, tracks the performance of nine major banks and insurers of the Chinese mainland. The Hang Seng Mainland Composite Index was down 1.23 percent to 3,191.62. Introduced on Oct. 3, 2001, and with the latest readjustment effective on March 9, 2009, the Hang Seng Mainland Composite Index gauges the performance of 132 Hong Kong-listed companies with principal places of business in Hong Kong and the Chinese mainland. The Hang Seng China-Affiliated Corporations Index went down 1.10 percent, to close at 3,614.42.
